If I understand Steve's proposal, I think I agree with it. My read is below Lovewell has more supply than above so no H. Co. water required.
Split H. Co. by acres, allow for pick up (nat flows) and divert accordingly.

I have thought of another concept to work with Delka on. If we open the radial gates for x amount (10-15 cfs) that much water will pass before the bays would fill. If there is more water, his bays will fill to some extent and if those flows get large enough to do something with we can try to decide where to deliver.

As of this moment, I still have not talked to Elvin Hobson.

Attached is a redraft with Nebraska's comments.

The primary changes we are suggesting:

NBID and KBID should share on a equitable basis whatever water is available for the Courtland Canal. The districts can figure this out.

Don't think we need the example for rotating or the detail on whether Courtland will be checked up.

One savings/no-precedent paragraph should be enough.

Still need whatever the Bureau thinks we need on storage.
