Sterling College has filed the above referenced new applications, and related change applications on existing water rights. This is a complex project involving multiple wells, numerous nearby wells, and offset water from a nearby irrigation well. The new applications were proposing to authorize several existing wells, which have been in use for many years for irrigation of the college campus and athletic fields. The wells are at various locations on the Sterling College property, all within the Southwest Quarter (SW¼) of Section 16, Township 21 South, Range 8 West, Rice County, Kansas. A representative of the college has signed all of the application forms stating they have access to the points of diversion. The wells are all located within the boundaries of Big Bend Groundwater Management District No. 5. A summary of the individual files is provided below.

Application, File Nos. 47,727; 47,732; 47,735; and 47,736 – Voluntary Dismissals

These applications have been pending for many years (since March 2011) and they were all filed for irrigation use from existing wells. The applications were recommended for denial by Big Bend Groundwater Management District No. 5 in a letter received on January 30, 2012. More specifically, K.A.R. 5-25-4 states, in part, that the entire district shall be closed to further new surface water and groundwater appropriations. The applicant was informed of the District's decision in a February 6, 2012 letter. The applications have been held since that time to allow the college to evaluate potential options for additional water. Based upon more recent discussions with the applicant, they have agreed to voluntarily dismiss each of these files. Voluntary dismissal forms for these files were received on June 12, 2017, and Findings and Orders will be prepared to dismiss these four applications.

Application, File No. 49,855 – 15 Acre-feet Exemption

In previous correspondence, Big Bend Groundwater Management District No. 5 had agreed to consider allowing a new application under K.A.R. 5-25-15 (15 acre-feet exemption). Application, File No. 49,855 was filed under this exemption. It is requesting 11.5 acre-feet of water and will overlap in point of diversion with Water Right, File Nos. 44,649 and 47,029, which authorized for irrigation of the football field at the south end of the campus. The two senior files combined are authorized 3.5 acre-feet. Therefore, the new application (File No. 49,855) was filed for the difference (15 AF - 3.5 AF) of 11.5 acre-feet.

Application, File No. 49,953 – 18 Acre-feet Off-Set (Water Right, File No. 33,291)

As noted above, the District is closed to new applications, unless they meet specific criterial. File No. 49,953 is requesting 18 acre-feet of water from a well designated as the Kelsey Hall Well. Per K.A.R. 5-25-4. Sustainable yield. (a) Except as set forth in subsections (b) and (c), the district has been determined to be appropriated to the sustainable yield level, and therefore the entire district shall be closed to further new surface water and groundwater appropriations filed on or after December 17, 1998. Exceptions to this closure include K.A.R. 5-25-4(b)(9) an application that proposes to use water in a manner so that there is no significant consumptive use of the local source of supply either in quantity or availability of water for use by other appropriators. The approval of File No. 49,953 is based on off-set water from Water Right, File No. 33,291. A "Request to Reduce a Portion of an Existing Water Right" form was received for Water Right, File No. 33,291 on June 6, 2017, signed by William and Betty Calderwood as Trustees. They have requested to reduce the quantity of water from 102 acre-feet to 84 acre-feet (a difference of 18 AF), and reduce the place of use from 68 acres to 56 acres.

The reduction request form also states that "This reduction request is contingent upon approval of pending water appropriations for Sterling College. The pending appropriations are in 16-21-8W, Rice County. This reduction request is part of the offset(s) for the pending files." A Findings and Order will be prepared for this reduction request.

The well authorized under Water Right, File No. 33,291 is located less than a mile (5,123 feet) from the proposed well under Application, File No. 49,953. Well logs appear similar, with a shallow sand and gravel layer, underlain by several feet of clay, then a deeper sand and gravel layer. Static water levels are also nearly the same. KGS Bulletin #206 "Geology and Hydrology of Rice County, Central Kansas" indicates the thickness of unconsolidated deposits for these wells ranges from 100 feet to 140 feet. The source of water appears to be alluvium and terrace deposits (undifferentiated fluvial deposits) of Quaternary Age. With these wells less than a mile apart, in the same source of supply, and relatively small quantity of water being offset, this new application is approvable under K.A.R. 5-25-4(b)(9) because it is proposing to use water in a manner so that there is no significant consumptive use of the local source of supply either in quantity or availability of water for use by other appropriators.

Water Right, File Nos. 44,649 and 47,029 - Place of Use Changes

Water Right, File Nos. 44,649 and 47,029 currently authorize 3.5 acre-feet of water for irrigation use of the football field. Change applications have been filed for both these files to create a complete overlap in place of use with File Nos. 49,855 and 49,953. The proposed place of use encompasses a total of 36 acres, which includes the football and baseball fields, and most of the green space area on the east portion of the campus. This ensures that no matter what well is being used, the water will be applied to authorized acreage. The new applications and change applications will be processed and signed as a package.

The applicant identified 27 domestic well owners whose wells are located less than 660 feet from the wells under File Nos. 49,855 and 49,953. The applicant has provided 26 signed "Domestic Well Spacing Consent Forms" from these nearby well owners. In addition, one of the domestic well owners wrote on his cover letter that he had no well, so no consent form was needed. The applicant also provided a list of nearly 100 domestic well owners within 1,000 feet, and notification letters were sent directly to these nearby well owners during the week of January 8, 2018. A couple of telephone calls were received with general questions, but no one expressed any concerns, and one caller expressed their support for the college. Finally, the applicant also published a public notice in the local newspaper "The Sterling Kanas Bulletin", and no responses of any kind were received regarding this public notice.

The proposed point of diversion for File No. 49,855 does not meet spacing to City of Sterling municipal supply wells, authorized under File Nos. VRC-03; 36,446 and 36,448, per K.A.R. 5-25-2. The applicant's senior file on this same well (File No. 47,029) was approved with a waiver of well spacing criteria. In addition, File No. 49,953 does not meet spacing to the applicant's existing irrigation well and thermal exchange wells. However, it does meet spacing to all other wells not owned by the applicant.

Copies of both the new and change applications were submitted to Big Bend Groundwater Management District No. 5 for their review on February 7, 2018. In a March 9, 2018 letter, GMD #5 recommended approval of both the new applications with waivers of spacing (K.A.R. 5-25-2) to domestic and non-domestic wells. In addition, Application, File No. 49,953 requires a waiver of K.A.R. 5-25-4 – sustainable yield (but the quantity is being offset as discussed above).

In accordance with K.S.A. 82a-706c, the Chief Engineer retains full authority to require any water user to install meters, gages, or other measuring devices, which devices he or she or his or her agents may read at any time. Water flowmeter requirements are further described in K.A.R. 5-1-4 through K.A.R 5-1-12. If any chemical or foreign substance is injected into the water pumped under this permit, a check valve will also need to be installed.

The proposed changes under File Nos. 44,649 and 47,029 comply with K.A.R. 5-5-11, as the changes are only proposing to create a complete overlap in the place of use with the new applications. Application, File Nos. 49,855 and 49,953 are sufficient to cover any increase in the consumptive use. Based on Water Use records, there have been no years of non-use. The referenced files are not abandoned pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-718, as determined by Jeff Lanterman, Water Commissioner, Stafford Field Office, and he provided a recommendation that the referenced new and change applications be approved in a March 13, 2018 e-mail.

Based on the above discussion, the quantity of water requested under File No. 49,953 is being offset by a senior file reduction (File No. 33,291), both approvals require a waiver of well spacing criteria; however the approvals of these applications will not impair senior water rights nor prejudicially or unreasonably affect the public interest. It is recommended that the referenced new applications be approved in conjunction with the change in place of use under File Nos. 44,649 and 47,029. The changes are reasonable, impairment of existing water rights is unlikely, and the additional quantity requested under Applications, File Nos. 49,855 and 49,953, is sufficient to cover any increase in the consumptive use, it is recommended that the referenced change applications also be approved.

Dear Mr. Landis:

There are enclosed permits (File Nos. 49,855 and 49,953) to appropriate water authorizing you to proceed with construction of the proposed diversion works (except those dams and stream obstructions regulated by K.S.A. 82a-301 through 305a), to divert such unappropriated water as may be available from the source and at the locations specified in these permits, and to use it for the purpose and at the location described in the permits.

Your attention is directed to the enclosures and to the terms, conditions, and limitations specified in these permits. Water meters are required and you must install them prior to water being put to beneficial use in order for you to maintain accurate records of water use. The meters should be used to provide the information required on the annual water use reports. Failure to notify the Chief Engineer of the Division of Water Resources of the completion of the diversion works within the time allowed, or within any authorized extension of time thereof, will result in the dismissal of these permits. Enclosed are forms which may be used to notify the Chief Engineer that the proposed diversion works have been completed for each file.

All requests for extensions of time to complete diversion works, or to perfect appropriations, must be submitted to the Chief Engineer before the expiration of time originally set forth in these permits to complete diversion works or to perfect an appropriation. If for any reason, you require an extension of time, you must request it before the expiration of time set forth in these permits. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in the dismissal of your permits or your water rights. Any request for an extension of time shall be accompanied by the required statutory fee, which is currently \$100.00 per file number. There is also enclosed an information sheet setting forth the procedure to obtain Certificates of Appropriation which will establish the extent of your water rights.

In addition, enclosed are Orders executed by the Chief Engineer, Division of Water Resources, Kansas Department of Agriculture, approving the Applications for Change in the Place of Use under Water Right, File Nos. 44,649 and 47,029. Your attention is directed to the enclosures and to the terms, conditions, and limitations specified in these approvals for change. The Water Appropriation Act requires that the Certificate of Appropriation shall be recorded with the Register of Deeds in the county or counties wherein the point of diversion is located as other instruments affecting real estate. Since the enclosed Orders for File Nos. 44,649 and 47,029, by the Chief Engineer modify said Certificates of Appropriation, they should also be recorded with the Register of Deeds.

The Chief Engineer, Division of Water Resources, Kansas Department of Agriculture, after due consideration of the written application of Sterling College, 125 W Cooper Street, Sterling, Kansas 67579-1533, received in this office on March 8, 2011, for approval of a change in the location of the place of use under the certificate of appropriation issued pursuant to the permit to appropriate water for beneficial use, finds that the change is reasonable and will not impair existing rights, and that the application should be and is hereby approved.

The effective date of the change shall be the date this order is executed by the Chief Engineer, after which the authorized location of the place of use shall be:

a total of 36 acres in Section 16, in Township 21 South, Range 8 West, Rice County, Kansas, located substantially as shown on the topographic map accompanying the application to change the place of use.

All diversion works into which any type of chemical or other foreign substance will be injected into the water pumped from the diversion works shall be equipped with an in-line, automatic, quick-closing check valve capable of preventing pollution of the source of the water supply. The type of valve installed shall meet specifications adopted by the Chief Engineer and shall be maintained in an operating condition satisfactory to the Chief Engineer.

The water right owner shall properly install an acceptable water meter on the diversion works authorized under this water right, prior to the use of water, in strict accordance with the Kansas Administrative Regulations 5-1-4 through 5-1-12 adopted by the Chief Engineer. The water right owner shall notify the Chief Engineer when installation of the water meter has been completed. The water right owner shall maintain the water meter in an operating condition satisfactory to the Chief Engineer, at all times during diversion of water and shall maintain records from which the total quantity of water diverted may be determined. The water right owner shall also report the reading of said water meter and the total quantity of water diverted annually to the Chief Engineer. Such records shall be furnished to the Chief Engineer by March 1 following the end of each calendar year.

In all other respects, the Certificate of Appropriation issued pursuant to Approval of Application, File No. 44,649, for permit to appropriate water for beneficial use, is as stated and set forth in the Certificate of Appropriation dated January 31, 2007.

RIGHT TO A HEARING AND TO ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW

If you are aggrieved by this Order, then pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-1901, you may:

- 1) request an evidentiary hearing before the Chief Engineer, or
- 2) request administrative review by the Secretary of Agriculture.

Failure to request an evidentiary hearing before the Chief Engineer does not preclude your right to administrative review by the Secretary.

To obtain an evidentiary hearing before the Chief Engineer, a written request for hearing must be filed within 15 days after service of this Order as provided in K.S.A. 77-531 (i.e., within a total of 18 days after this Order was mailed to you), with: Kansas Department of Agriculture, Attn: Legal Section, 1320 Research Park Drive, Manhattan, Kansas 66502, FAX (785) 564-6777.

If you do not file a request for an evidentiary hearing before the Chief Engineer, you may petition for administrative review of the Order by the Secretary of Agriculture. A petition for review shall be in writing and state the basis for requesting administrative review. The request for hearing may be denied if the request fails to clearly establish factual or legal issues for review. See K.S.A. 77-527. The petition must be filed within 30 days after service of this Order as provided in K.S.A. 77-531 (i.e., within a total of 33 days after this Order was mailed to you), and be filed with: Secretary of Agriculture, Attn: Legal Division, Kansas Department of Agriculture, 1320 Research Park Drive, Manhattan, Kansas 66502, FAX (785) 564-6777.

If neither a request for an evidentiary hearing nor a petition for administrative review is filed as set forth above, then this Order shall be effective and become a final agency action as defined in K.S.A. 77-607(b). Failure to timely request either an evidentiary hearing or administrative review may preclude further judicial review under the Kansas Judicial Review Act.

The Big Bend Groundwater Management District #5 reviewed the above referenced applications at the March regular board meeting. Based upon information received in the District office and provided at the board meeting, the applications do not meet K.A.R. 5-25-2 for the minimum spacing to nearby domestic and non-domestic wells. Additionally, the application for permit for File No. 49953 does not meet the requirements for K.A.R. 5-25-4(a). It is apparent that the applicant has been proactive in acquiring the voluntary spacing waivers from the nearby well owners, publishing the public notice requesting public responses, and working with nearby water rights to acquire an offset for application no. 49953.

Following discussion, the Board voted to recommend a waiver of K.A.R. 5-25-2 and K.A.R. 5-25-4 and recommend approval of the applications as presented.

The applications are subject to the District's well equipment regulation K.A.R. 5-25-5 for required flow meters.

On January 30, 2012, we received a recommendation from Big Bend Groundwater Management District No. 5 regarding the above referenced files. The District has recommended approval of the change applications for File Nos. 44,649 and 47,029, and approval of the thermal exchange applications, File Nos. 47,733 and 47,734. Finally, the District is willing to allow a 15 acre-feet small user permit under specific terms.

File Nos. 47,727; 47,732; 47,735; and 47,736 for Application for Permit to Appropriate Water for Beneficial Use are recommended for denial (unless one of these applications is considered under the 15 acre-feet small user program). These recommendations were based upon the groundwater management program adopted by the District and approved by the Chief Engineer, Division of Water Resources, Kansas Department of Agriculture, More specifically, K.A.R. 5-25-4 states, in part, that the entire district shall be closed to further new surface water and groundwater appropriations.

We are advising you of these recommendations in order to allow you an opportunity to consult with the District regarding their recommendations if you have not already done so. Once approved, compliance with the terms, conditions and limitations of the permit is necessary. Conservation of the water resources of Kansas is required.

Section 82a-728 of the Kansas Water Appropriation Act, provides (a) except for the appropriation of water for the purpose of domestic use, . . . it shall be unlawful for any person to appropriate or threaten to appropriate water from any source without first applying for and obtaining a permit to appropriate water in accordance with the provisions of the Water Appropriation Act or for any person to violate any condition of a vested right, appropriation right or an approved application for a permit to appropriate water for beneficial use.

(b) (1) The violation of any provision of this section by any person is a class C misdemeanor... A class C misdemeanor is punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500 and/or a term of confinement not to exceed one month in the county jail. Each day that the violation occurs constitutes a separate offense.




