- 1. That K.A.R. 5-4-4(c)(1) states, that the distance from the well which is the subject of the application to all other senior non-domestic and non-temporary wells in the same aquifer or a hydraulically connected aquifer.
- 2. That K.A.R. 5-4-4(c)(1)(A) requires a minimum well spacing of four (4) miles between wells whose common source of supply is the confined Dakota aquifer system.
- The proposed point of diversion, for File No. 49,715 and the well authorized by File No. 42,483 are approximately 0.24 miles apart.
- 4. That the wells authorized under File Nos. 42,483 & 49,715 are both owned by Barry Urban, applicant.
- 5. Kelly Stewart, Water Commissioner, Stockton Filed Office recommended approval of the proposed application with a waiver of the well spacing.
- 7. That a waiver of K.A.R. 5-4-4(c)(1)(A) will not prejudicially or unreasonably affect the public interest and will not impair any existing water rights.

Barry Urban on behalf of Professional Swine Management, has filed the above referenced application to appropriate 95.77 acre-feet (31.207 million gallons) of groundwater at a diversion rate of 800 gallons per minute for stockwatering use, from a battery of four wells in the Smoky Hill River Basin. The geographic center of the battery of four (4) wells is located in the Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (NW¼ NW¼ SW¼) of Section 3, more particularly described as being near a point 2,593 feet North and 4,920 feet West of the Southeast corner, in Township 16 South, Range 17 West, in Rush County, Kansas.

The place of use is a feedlot located in the Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (NW½ SW½) of Section 3, Township 16 South, Range 17 West, Rush County, Kansas. Water Right, File No. 42,483 will overlap the place of use and was certified at 12.66 acre-feet (4.125 million gallons). Currently the feedlot has approximately 1,000 head of sows and associated pigs, Professional Swine Management has plans of expanding the operation requiring the need of this new appropriation. See attached Stockwatering Use Supplemental Sheet for justification of quantity requested.

The source of water for the pending application appears to be the **confined** Dakota aquifer system based on the test hole log that was submitted. A sandstone unit was encountered from 340 feet to 370 feet below ground surface; however the full extent of the sandstone aquifer cannot be readily determined by the test hole log or other well logs. Static water level is 143 feet below ground surface, clearly extending above the top of any potential sandstone aquifer. No specific safe yield evaluation has been adopted by the chief engineer for the confined Dakota aquifer system, although it is likely that the confined Dakota aquifer system would receive significantly less recharge then a near-surface; unconfined aquifer. Therefore, in order to better represent the potential recharge to this confined aquifer, it was determined that the saturated thickness of the aquifer and the thickness of the confining unit are critical factors. Limited saturated thickness with a significant confining unit would get less recharge (0.3 times the "standard" K.A.R. 5-3-11 value), while significant saturated thickness with a limited confining unit would get more recharge (0.5 times the "standard" K.A.R. 5-3-11 value).

For this application, the saturated thickness cannot be determined, however from the Kansas Geological Survey "Geohydrology of Rush County" the Dakota formation can be estimated to have a thickness in feet between 200-300, which results in a factor of 1. A factor equal to 1 gets 0.4 times the "normal" recharge. The K.A.R. 5-3-11 safe yield recharge value was determined to be 1.05 inches. Multiplying 1.05 inches x 0.4 results in a recharge of 0.42 inches. There is a very limited number of well logs in the area. However, well logs along the North Half of the circle are sourcing alluvium aquifers from the Smokey Hill River and are excluded from the safe yield calculation. There is only one other well in this area (Water Right, File No. 42,483) that is producing from the confined Dakota aquifer system. It is reasonable to presuppose, that all of the two-mile circle is underlain by the confined Dakota aquifer system. This provides an area of consideration of 8,042 acres. 8,042 acres x 0.42 inches x 75% recharge available / 12 provides a safe yield of 216.13 acre-feet. There is only one other water right in this area of consideration potentially sourcing the confined Dakota aquifer system, which has appropriated 12.66 acre-feet, leaving 203.47 acre-feet available, the application complies with safe yield (see attached calculation sheet).

Per K.A.R. 5-4-4, based on this source of supply, the minimum spacing distance from the point of diversion to all non-domestic wells in the same aquifer is four (4) miles. The proposed point of diversion described in this application was located less than the required spacing distance from one nearby non-domestic well (42,483), also owned by the applicant. A Waiver Request for well to well spacing has been submitted by the applicant, who is the owner of both wells involved. No domestic wells were identified by the applicant or the WWC-5 database, nor any potential domestic wells from homesteads can be found from aerial imagery. Thus, no nearby well owner notices were sent out.

In accordance with K.S.A. 82a-706c, the Chief Engineer retains full authority to require any water user to install meters, gages, or other measuring devices, which devices he or she or his or her agents may read at any time. Water flowmeter requirements are further described in K.A.R. 5-1-4 through K.A.R. 5-1-12. If any chemical or foreign substance is injected into the water pumped under this permit, a check valve will also need to be installed. The applicant has submitted a signed a Minimum Desirable Streamflow form, which has been properly notarized. By completing this statement, the applicant affirms his/her knowledge that there could be times when the diversion of water may not be allowed under this permit.

In a April 12, 2017 e-mail, Kelly Stewart, Water Commissioner, Stockton Field Office, recommended approval of the referenced application and waiver of well sapcing. Based on the above discussion, safe yield criteria are met, and approval of the application will not impair senior water rights nor prejudicially or unreasonably affect the public interest, it is recommended that the referenced application be approved.

for a permit to appropriate water for beneficial use, together with the maps, plans and other submitted data, and that the application is hereby approved and the applicant is hereby authorized, subject to vested rights and prior appropriations, to proceed with the construction of the proposed diversion works (except those dams and stream obstructions regulated by K.S.A. 82a-301 through 305a, as amended), and to proceed with all steps necessary for the application of the water to the approved and proposed beneficial use and otherwise perfect the proposed appropriation subject to the following terms, conditions and limitations:

- 1. That the priority date assigned to such application is **October 11, 2016.**
- 2. 4. That the water sought to be appropriated shall be used for stock watering use in the Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (NW¼ SW¼) of Section 3, in Township 16 South, Range 17 West, Rush County, Kansas.
- 3. That the authorized source from which the appropriation shall be made is groundwater, to be withdrawn by means of a battery of four (4) wells with a geographic center located in the Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter (NW¼ NW¼ SW¼), of Section 3, more particularly described as being near a point 2,593 feet North and 4,920 feet West of the Southeast corner of said section, in Township 16 South, Range 17 West, Rush County, Kansas, located substantially as shown on the topographic map accompanying the application.
- 4. That the appropriation sought shall be limited to a maximum diversion rate not in excess of **800 gallons** per minute (1.78 c.f.s.) and to a quantity not to exceed **31.207 million gallons** (95.77 acre-feet) of water for any calendar year.
- 5. That installation of works for diversion of water shall be completed on or before <u>December 31, 2018</u> or within any authorized extension thereof. The applicant shall notify the Chief Engineer and pay the statutorily required field inspection fee of \$400.00 when construction of the works has been completed. Failure to timely submit the notice and the fee will result in revocation of the permit. Any request for an extension of time shall be submitted prior to the expiration of the deadline and shall be accompanied by the required statutory fee of \$100.00.
- 6. That the proposed appropriation shall be perfected by the actual application of water to the proposed beneficial use on or before <u>December 31, 2022</u> or any authorized extension thereof. Any request for an extension of time shall be submitted prior to the expiration of the deadline and shall be accompanied by the required statutory fee of \$100.00.

- 7. That the applicant shall not be deemed to have acquired a water appropriation for a quantity in excess of the amount approved herein nor in excess of the amount found by the Chief Engineer to have been actually used for the approved purpose during one calendar year subsequent to approval of the application and within the time specified for perfection or any authorized extension thereof.
- 8. That the use of water herein authorized shall not be made so as to impair any use under existing water rights nor prejudicially and unreasonably affect the public interest.
- 9. That the right of the appropriator shall relate to a specific quantity of water and such right must allow for a reasonable raising or lowering of the static water level and for the reasonable increase or decrease of the streamflow at the appropriator's point of diversion.
- 10. That this permit does not constitute authority under K.S.A. 82a-301 through 305a to construct any dam or other obstruction; nor does it grant any right-of-way, or authorize entry upon or injury to, public or private property.
- 11. That all diversion works constructed under the authority of this permit into which any type of chemical or other foreign substance will be injected into the water pumped from the diversion works shall be equipped with an in-line, automatic quick-closing, check valve capable of preventing pollution of the source of the water supply. The type of valve installed shall meet specifications adopted by the Chief Engineer and shall be maintained in an operating condition satisfactory to the Chief Engineer.
- 12. That all wells with a diversion rate of 100 gallons per minute or more drilled under the authority of this permit shall have a tube or other device installed in a manner acceptable to, and in accordance with specifications adopted by, the Chief Engineer. This tube or device shall be suitable for making water level measurements and shall be maintained in a condition satisfactory to the Chief Engineer.
- 13. That an acceptable water flow meter shall be installed and maintained on the diversion works authorized by this permit in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Regulations 5-1-4 through 5-1-12 adopted by the Chief Engineer. This water flow meter shall be used to provide an accurate quantity of water diverted as required for the annual water use report (including the meter reading at the beginning and end of the report year).
- 14. That the applicant shall maintain accurate and complete records from which the quantity of water diverted during each calendar year may be readily determined and the applicant shall file an annual water use report with the Chief Engineer by March 1 following the end of each calendar year. Failure to file the annual water use report by the due date shall cause the applicant to be subject to a civil penalty.
- 15. That no water user shall engage in nor allow the waste of any water diverted under the authority of this permit.
- 16. That failure without cause to comply with provisions of the permit and its terms, conditions and limitations will result in the forfeiture of the priority date, revocation of the permit and dismissal of the application.
- 17. That the right to appropriate water under authority of this permit is subject to any minimum desirable streamflow requirements identified and established pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-703c for the source of supply to which this water right applies.

18. That the quantity of water approved under this permit is further limited to the quantity which combined with Water Right, File No. 42,483, will provide a total **not to exceed 31.207 million gallons (95.77 acre-feet)** of water per calendar year, for irrigation on the land described herein.

This Order shall become a final agency action, as defined by K.S.A. 77-607(b), without further notice to the parties, if a request for hearing or a petition for administrative review is not filed as set forth below.

Request for Hearing. According to K.A.R. 5-14-3(c), any party who desires a hearing must submit a request within 15 days after the date shown on the Certificate of Service attached to this Order. Filing a request for a hearing will give you the opportunity to submit additional facts for consideration, contest any findings made by the Chief Engineer, or present any other information you believe should be considered in this matter. A timely-filed request for hearing will stay the deadline for requesting administrative review of this Order pending the outcome of the hearing.

Petition for Review. The applicant, if aggrieved by this Order, may petition for administrative review, pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-711(c) and K.S.A. 82a-1901(a). The petition must be filed within 30 days after the date shown on the Certificate of Service attached to this Order and must set forth the basis for the review, unless stayed by the timely filing of a request for hearing.

Any request for hearing or petition for administrative review shall be in writing and shall be submitted to the attention of: Chief Legal Counsel, Kansas Department of Agriculture, 1320 Research Park Drive, Manhattan, Kansas 66502, Fax: (785) 564-6777.





This would provide more recharge to a well that has a thinner confining unit and greater saturated thickness (i.e. a higher factor score).

Further review indicates that saturated thickness of the aguifer and thickness of confining unit are the 2 key variables that would most likely influence well production and recharge, respectively. Therefore, a weighted system was designed to account for this by dividing the saturated thickness by the thickness of the confining unit. The less confining unit you have the higher the recharge potential and the greater the saturated thickness the better production you will get from the well. This ratio provides a factor which can be used to evaluate the percentage of safe yield to consider as reasonable. Your application for permit to appropriate water in 3-16S-17W in Rush County, was received and has been assigned the file number noted above.

As a matter of record, the Division of Water Resources has on hand a large number of applications awaiting processing. Therefore to be fair to all concerned, and so that we can process those applications on hand in the order they were received, we intend to concentrate on the backlog of applications until the issue is resolved. Once review of your application has begun, we will contact you, if additional information is required.

In accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Water Appropriation Act, a portion of which is included below, the use of water as proposed prior to approval of the application is unlawful. Once approved, compliance with the terms, conditions and limitations of the permit is necessary. Conservation of the water resources of Kansas is required.

Section 82a-728 of the Kansas Water Appropriation Act, provides (a) except for the appropriation of water for the purpose of domestic use, ... it shall be unlawful for any person to appropriate or threaten to appropriate water from any source without first applying for and obtaining a permit to appropriate water in accordance with the provisions of the Water Appropriation Act or for any person to violate any condition of a vested right, appropriation right or an approved application for a permit to appropriate water for beneficial use.

(b) (1) The violation of any provision of this section by any person is a class C misdemeanor . . .

A class C misdemeanor is punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500 and/or a term of confinement not to exceed one month in the county jail. Each day that the violation occurs constitutes a separate offense.
